Polgooth Inn, Polgooth

Our fantastic local pub, the Polgooth Inn (below) is just a 10-15 minute stroll from Bosinver. Head past Apple cottage along the lane into Polgooth Village and turn left along the road. Please note the unmade lane can get muddy after rain and you'll need a torch if returning after dark. (Alternatively our 100% electric local taxi firm C&C taxis 01726 63538 will be pleased to help you return home safely!) The pub was formerly a miners' counting house and has been an inn since the early 18th century. With a bar, family room and large garden the Polgooth Inn serves a variety of food to suit all tastes and runs occasional music events and quizzes.
