## **Games Room**

At the bottom of the hill at Bosinver is the Games Room. Here you can play table tennis, table football, pool, tabletop pac-man and Pucket.

You can borrow a fishing rod from the reception office and try to catch a fish from the platforms around the lake. You will need to have a grown up to make sure you are safe while you do this. Always put the fish back into the water if you do catch one.

#### Wild kids

In the field opposite Lowen cottage and through our special gate in the hedge is our Wild Kids hut – have a look on our map outside reception office to see where it is.

If you would like to, you can join in one of our 'Wild Kids' sessions with Tatum, our Forest School leader. These sessions are free and take place usually on a Thursday afternoon as long as there are 8 or more children who want to do it.

With Tatum you might chop some wood, make a water slide, learn about wildlife on the farm, build a bug house or toast a marshmallow on the camp fire in the hut.

### Meet our farm animals

Every morning, you can help Farmer Dave to feed the animals if you would like to.

Opposite the farmhouse (the big cottage with a thatched roof just past the red office) is a seat made out of a cartwheel. This is where you gather for animal feeding with Farmer Dave at 9.30am each morning.



Farmer Dave will greet you here and take you down to meet our friendly farm animals. We have chickens, ducks, goats, horses and sheep on the farm.

## Pony rides

One morning you might like to book a pony ride. This happens straight after animal feeding.

We meet opposite the Farmhouse at Bosinver where we gather for animal feeding. We have three white Welsh ponies called Kizzy, Secret and Crystal who give children rides. You may also see other bigger Shire horses on the farm and our old brown pony Rupert but these are not used for riding.

You may have to wait for your turn, but if you want to, you can tell us that you are going to play in the outdoor play area nearby or go to your cottage and we will come to get you when it is your turn.

You have to wear a riding hat and shoes, not sandals to ride on the pony so you are safe.

We will help you to get on the pony safely. Once, you are on, someone will lead the pony to be safe and a grown up who looks after you will come with you too.

We will take you on a short ride up and down the lane at Bosinver. We hope you enjoy it!
